## **CHECKLIST**

**BEFORE ARRIVAL** 



Once you have been accepted, you will need to begin preparing for the experience you are about to live. Here is a reminder what you need to do:

0	Verify the validity of your passport. Request renewal when your passport will soon expire.
<u>If yo</u>	u are NOT a European citizen:
0	Apply for your visa (4 to 3 months before your arrival) - Make sure that you apply for it as soon as you have received confirmation of your admission. (See <u>"Visas and</u> "
$\bigcirc$	Resident permits") Subscribe to a private health insurance (if applicable). (See "Health & Insurance")
<u>If yo</u>	u are a European citizen:
0	Request your European Health Insurance Card.
0	Prepare documents that you might need once in France: - a copy of your Passport or ID, - a copy of international health insurance, - a copy of your birth certificate showing your parents' information or other documents, along with a translation if possible (see "Health & Insurance"), - your acceptance letter, - a copy of your visa (if already obtained).
0	Look for your accommodation and guarantor. (See "Accommodation & Housing")
0	Inform your bank of your departure and check if your credit/debit card can be used in France.
0	Obtain a repatriation insurance (not mandatory, but strongly recommended). (See " <u>Health &amp; Insurance</u> ")
$\bigcirc$	Obtain a personal civil liability insurance. (See "Health & Insurance")
0	Obtain your CVEC once you are granted your visa. (See "Succeed in your studies in France"
0	If you have a disability, make sure to inform our team in advance and reach out to the disability person contact of your future school/program.

## **UPON ARRIVAL**

We advise you to arrive a few weeks before your first day of school as you will need to undertake many administrative procedures (resident permits, health insurance, bank account) and look for accommodation.

0	Choose your commuter pass. (See " <u>Transportatio</u> n")	
0	Find an accommodation	
Once you have found an accommodation: (see "Accommodation & Housing")		
0	Obtain a housing insurance before getting the keys.	
0	Apply for the housing subsidy from the CAF.	
0	If not included in the rent, open an account for electricity and gas.	
$\bigcirc$	If not included in the rent, purchase an internet connection.

	Cancel your internet and mobile phone account with your provider. (See <u>"before returning to your home country – Accommodation &amp; Housing"</u> )	
0	Cancel your commuter pass (if applicable). (See "Transportation")	
5	Leave your French bank open as you might receive deposits such as your final housing subsidy, security deposit on your lodging, etc. (See "Before returning to your home country — Banking, Budgeting & Scholarships")
